## **REGULAR MEETING REPORT**

The Age Group Committee met January 27, 2022 from 8:00-9:20 pm. The following topics were discussed and decisions were made:

- 1. The Age Group Committee reviewed the WAG meet with two sites.
  - Thank you to Golden West and San Clemente for helping out so that all swimmers had an opportunity to swim.
- 2. The Age Group Committee reviewed the Pacific Coast All Star Team which competed January 9-10th in Pacifica, CA.
  - SCS won the meet
  - Thank you to all coaches and swimmers who participated in this meet.
  - Challenges with apparel were identified and the Chair of this Committee will make adjustments to prevent issues in the future.
- The Age Group Committee reviewed the Coaches Clinic on Friday, January 21st as a part of the SCS All Star Festival Meet.
  - Sarah Dawson MVN spoke on Age Group Lesson Learned
  - Brett Hawke from Fitter and Faster hosted a classroom presentation on sprinting and mental toughness of elite athletes.
  - Brett Hawke hosted an in water presentation using the National Team from Sandpipers to demonstrate work with turns.
  - Chance for coaches to meet each other and talk about swimming.
  - Tentative plans to make this clinic more involving and more enticing for coaches from across SCS to attend.
- 4. The Age Group Committee reviewed the SCS All Star Festival Meet in Las Vegas, January 22-23rd.
  - A huge thank you to coaches, officials, admin, and swimmers for a great weekend
  - Pros of having the meet in Las Vegas:
    - True feeling of an All Star Trip
    - Two day format allowed swimmers to swim multiple events and relays
    - Swimmers were away from their usual routine and got to meet new kids from all over the LSC
    - Pool party was a big success as the swimmers were able to relax and just hang out with their new friends
  - Cons of having the meet in Las Vegas

- Travel Costs for the family
- Committee is considering placement of the 2023 Festival Meet in Las Vegas and the long term viability of placing the meet in Las Vegas.
- 5. The Age Group Committee discussed the challenges of assigning teams for JAG, Summer JOs and WAG
  - Goal #1: Would like to see some sort of rotation in terms of sites that teams attend
  - Goal #2: Would like to see some sort of diversity in terms of competition for our swimmers
  - Goal #3: Would like to see balance at each meet
  - Plan was agreed upon to send each team a Google Form to express the goals above and provide some clarification on the number of swimmers anticipated at each meet. We will also ask for a preference of site, though this will not be guaranteed.
- 6. The Age Group Committee introduced a plan to bring a "Spring JO" type meet to end the summer season.
  - This would be for 2023
  - Top swimmers in the LSC would be able to race each other modeled after Spring JOs
  - The details of the plan are still developing through discussion and critique from the members of the Age Group Committee
  - Where this meet falls and if it takes the place of an existing JO meet is still being debated.
- 7. The Age Group Committee is beginning the selection process for the Coaching Staff for the Age Group Zone Meet
  - Goal is to have a coaching representative from each Geo Committee
