- Be clear and precise with your message
- Explain this great team accomplishment
- If given permission, shout out your members who participated in accomplishing this team goal

<u>Facebook</u>

General guidelines:

- Take advantage of boosting posts (Boosting posts allow you to pay a small fee to target specific audiences for a duration from your Facebook page.)
- Make sure your images are properly formatted
 - o For a post, picture size should be: 1,200 x 630 pixels
 - o For a banner, picture size should be: 820 x 312 pixels
- Pin important posts, such as becoming Safe Sport Recognized, to the top of your page
- Tag your partners such as USA Swimming to further your reach

Type of post:

- Pick a picture which represents both your team and Safe Sport. Some examples could be a team photo, team logo, or a group picture of those who completed the trainings.
- Picture must be high quality (no blurry pictures or text too small to read)
- Ideal picture size: 1,200 x 630 pixels
- Explain your amazing new accomplishment of becoming Safe Sport Recognized and what it took to receive this

Examples on what to say:

- *EXCITING NEWS* We are officially a @USASwimming Safe Sport Recognized club! It shows our dedication to making the sport of swimming a healthy and positive environment, free from abuse for our athletes on [insert team name]. We hope all teams will strive towards this status so we can continue to make this a sport of the future. Please reach out to our head coach or board if you have any questions. #SafeSport
- We are thrilled to announce [team's name] is a USA Swimming Safe Sport Recognized club! This is an exciting time for our team and we want to continue to be a leader in our community to provide a healthy and positive environment, free from abuse for our athletes. The process to become recognized was not easy but we truly believe it is our responsibility to provide the best environment for our athletes, coaches, and parents. General Guidelines:

- Maintain your team voice/brand when tweeting
- @ mention when appropriate
- If you are posting a picture, landscape usually works best
- Use a relevant hashtag (such as #SafeSport)
- Follow peers & competitors
- Engage when people comment
- Retweet content which is relevant to your team

Type of post:

- Post must be less than 280 characters (per Twitter guidelines)
- Explain your excitement about becoming a Safe Sport Recognized club!
- This is an accomplishment, remember that when you post
- You can add emojis to make it fun

General Guidelines:

- Use clear, good quality photos
- Post pictures which align with your team standards & culture
- Always uphold your team vision & mission

Type of post:

- Pick a high-quality photo that represents your team and Safe Sport. Some examples could be a team photo, team logo, or a group picture of those who completed the trainings.
- Write a comment about your amazing new accomplishment of becoming a Safe Sport Recognized club
- Ideally, post a picture size of 1080 x 1080 pixels

Who to reach out to?

- Local sport reporters
- Reporters with specialty in swimming or other sports
- Think about who gives out local swimming information they might be a good resource!

How to reach out to your local reporter

General guidelines:

- Timing is everything try to send pitch before noon
- No longer than 2-3 paragraphs
- State your new status & why it is important for the community to know about it
- Include Safe Sport info (given and approved by our team, see below <u>do not write something</u> <u>else up</u>)
- Email is the most preferred method of contact

<u>Ideas on what to include about your team</u>

- How many athletes registered with your club
- When your club was established
- Coaches names and info
- Unique things you have done in the community

Safe Sport info paragraph:

USA Swimming is committed to providing a healthy and positive environment free from abuse for all its members. USA Swimming's Safe Sport program, a comprehensive abuse prevention program, consists of a multi-layered approach to keep kids safe, including: required policies and best practice guidelines; mandatory screening, criminal background checks and employment screening; training and education; monitoring, supervision and mandatory reporting. These measures are informed by experts in the field of child safety and are among the strongest safeguards found in youth-serving organizations.
